In surveying the current art scene, it is obvious that one of the concerns of contemporary artists is to stretch the boundaries of the traditional disciplines of painting and sculpture; to explore, combine, and ultimately to create new works that are as dependent on their painterly qualities as on their three-dimensionality. The boundaries have blurred, and in some cases, dissolved.

Each artist in this exhibition employs an expressive use of color, an inventiveness in use of material and a personal vision that is furthered by his or her unique way of working. The works are of painted metal, canvas, clay, wood, papier maché, cement, Rhoplex, wax and wire mesh. Some are painted sculptures, some are sculptured paintings, and some are so intertwined that new terminology may be in order.
